# Alabama Wildlife Federation Programs & Projects

## CONSERVATION EDUCATION

**Alabama Nature Center (ANC)**  
 The Alabama Nature Center, located at Lanark (AWF's State Headquarters) in Millbrook, Alabama, is a *Planned-Use Outdoor Education Facility* offering hands-on, outdoor-based educational programs and activities for students, educators, church and civic groups, and the general public. Lanark and the ANC contain 350 acres of striking forests, fields, streams, wetlands and ponds that are traversed by five miles of trails and boardwalks. The ANC is open to the general public every third weekend of the month and daily for students in grades K-12 during the school year. Future opportunities at the ANC include after-school programs, summer day camps, wildlife seminars, and more!



**Discovering Our Heritage (DOH) Program**  
 The DOH program organizes existing environmental education activities into a structured, comprehensive format and provides pre-planned lessons that guide the teacher throughout the scholastic year.

**Alabama Outdoor Classroom (OC) Program**  
 The OC program provides technical and organizational assistance for schools that wish to create an effective, sustainable outdoor classroom and schoolyard wildlife habitat site for hands-on learning opportunities on school grounds.

**AWF William R. Ireland, Sr. Youth Wildlife Art Contest**  
 AWF's program to foster wildlife conservation by stimulating the interest of K-12 students through artistic depictions of Alabama's wildlife.

**Teacher Training Workshops**  
 AWF hosts numerous workshops for teachers who would like to implement the DOH and OC programs at their school. These workshops provide important information on how to integrate conservation education into the curriculum and cover a variety of topics including forestry, aquatic studies, birds and butterflies, and much more.



## RESOURCE STEWARDSHIP

**Land Stewardship Assistance**  
 AWF's professional wildlife biologist is devoted to assisting landowners with wildlife management on private lands.

**Alabama Wildlife Magazine**  
 AWF's quarterly magazine devoted to informing its members of organizational activities, wildlife and related natural resource issues, and how-to information for improving wildlife habitat.



**Delta Lands Purchase**  
 On behalf of the Alabama Forever Wild Land Trust, the AWF helped secure 47,000 acres in the Mobile-Tensaw Delta for public use.

**State and National Legislative Affairs**  
 AWF monitors legislation and provides critical insight to legislative members and committees on matters regarding wildlife and related natural resource conservation, hunting and angling.



**Managing Wildlife Book**  
 A 600-page hardback book outlining responsible land management practices that can be employed by landowners and land managers to promote abundant and healthy wildlife populations.

**Alabama Black Bear Alliance (ABBA)**  
 A diverse public/private partnership working to promote voluntary conservation of the black bear in Alabama through education, research, and habitat management.

**Wildlife Seminar Series**  
 AWF organizes and hosts speaker seminars across Alabama to discuss various wildlife related subjects important to our members and outdoor enthusiasts in general.

## HUNTING & ANGLING HERITAGE

**AWF Wild Game Cook-Offs**  
 Wild game cooking competitions held across the state that provide a fellowship opportunity for AWF members, an avenue for non-members to learn more about AWF, needed funds for AWF projects, and an opportunity to show the general public that responsible sportsmen and women utilize the game animals that they harvest.

**Alabama Quail Trail**  
 A public/private partnership whose goal is to focus the interest and resources in quail hunting, quail research and quail conservation in a manner that achieves benefits for quail and stimulates rural economic development opportunities.

**Operation GameWatch**  
 A toll free hotline (1-800-272-GAME) for reporting poaching and game violations. Cash rewards are paid to individuals who play a critical role in the arrest and conviction of poachers.



**AWF Outdoor Women's Network**  
 AWF's program that promotes and provides direct hunting, angling and other outdoor recreation opportunities for women in a manner that increases personal participation in target outdoor activities and the Alabama Wildlife Federation.

**AWF Youth Fishing Rodeo**  
 An AWF program designed to provide Alabama's youth a chance to experience the outdoors and learn about fishing. Our goal is to instill a lifelong love of fishing and the outdoors in our young people. These events provide opportunities for families to share fun and quality time together while participating in one of our nation's favorite pastimes.

## AWF's History

Sportsmen established the Federation in 1935 to promote wildlife and related natural resource conservation to insure a high quality of life for future generations of Alabamians.

Since 1935, AWF has been a key player in Alabama wildlife conservation efforts. A few examples include:

- Increasing Funding for Wildlife and Fisheries Programs
- Alabama Nature Center
