Option #1 on Page 1: "Living & Nonliving Characteristics" Brainstorming Chart — Create a chart with one heading and two columns (or use the empty chart below on page 1) on your Elmo, white board or flipchart, and then ask the students to brainstorm to help you fill in the chart. Help the students look for patterns as evidence in their answers
