

# Whorled Milkweed

Asclepias verticillata

Plant Description – Native, herb/wildflower, deciduous, perennial

Height: 1-3 ft Width/Spread: 1-2 ft





#### **Leaves**

Shape: Linear

Margin: Entire

Arrangement: Whorled

Form: Simple

Leaf Description: Leaves are 2-3 inches long and narrow, arranged in whorls of 3-6 along stem; attached directly to the stem (sessile); underside is whitish-green with short hairs

### Flower/Bloom

Flower Color: Greenish-white

Flower Shape: Tubulate In Bloom: May-Sep

**Flower Description:** Flowers are small (up to ¼ inch long), fragrant, and 5-petaled; found in umbrella-shaped clusters of about 7-20 flowers





# **Ecological Benefits**

Nectar source for hummingbirds, butterflies, bees, and other pollinators; seed source for birds; host plant for Monarch butterfly

# Fruits & Seeds

Spreads via: Seeds and Rhizomes Seed Type: Fruit – Dry seed pod

Months in Seed: Late Summer – Early Fall

Fruit and Seed Description: Fruit is smooth, narrow seed pod about 3-4 inches long and 0.5 inches wide; pod splits open when mature releasing flat, oval, brown seeds with long tufts of white hair

### **Maintenance Notes**

Dormant in winter; cut plant back in late winter to early spring. Wait until you see new growth and cut the old stems back to about 6 inches from the ground; cutting flowers after they are spent will promote further blooms; great fresh cut flower and dried seed pod is ornamental; prefers average amount of water (water two times per week in summer, once per week otherwise)
