

Woodland Stonecrop

Sedum ternatum

Plant Description – Native, herb/wildflower, evergreen, perennial

Height: 0.5 ft Width/Spread: 0.75 ft





Leaves

Shape: Ovate

Margin: Entire

Arrangement: Alternate Form: Simple

Leaf Description: Light green; up to 1-inch long; grow in whorls of three; flowering stems have smaller leaves than non-flowering stems

Flower/Bloom

Flower Color: White

Flower Shape: Stellate

In Bloom: Mar-Jun

Flower Description: Radially symmetrical with 4-5 petals with sharp points and green sepals and purple stamens; ½-inch wide; occur in clusters at ends of three curved branches per flower stalk



Fruits & Seeds

Spreads via: Seeds

Seed Type: Fruit – Dry seed pod

Months in Seed: Summer

Fruit and Seed Description: Fruit is small capsule that splits open when ripe to release many small, dark brown seeds

Ecological Benefits

Nectar source for butterflies and other pollinators; seed source for birds

Maintenance Notes

Dormant in winter; cut back after flowering to maintain fullness; plant is likely to self-seed; prefers average amount of water (water two times per week in summer, once per week otherwise)
