

Lavender

Lavandula angustifolia

Plant Description – non-native, herb/wildflower, evergreen, perennial

Height: 2 - 3 ft Width/Spread: 2 - 4 ft





Leaves

Shape: lanceolate & linear

Margin: entire

Arrangement: opposite
Form: simple

Leaf Description: square stems; leaves are soft, velvety, highly aromatic, gray-green to green-purple in summer, narrow, up to 2.5 inches long and less than an inch wide

Flower/Bloom

Flower Color: purple, white, pink

In Bloom: Jun - Aug

Flower Shape: funnelform

Flower(s) Description: aromatic flowers in clusters on spikes up to 3 inches long; flower is less than a half inch in size, trumpet-shaped, 2-lipped with 2 lobes on the upper lip and 3 lobes on the lower lip





Fruits & Seeds

Spreads via: Seeds

Seed Type: nut

Fruit and Seed Description: flowers dry and release nutlets

silvery-green to gray-bronzed leaves in winter; prefers average watering
