

# **Cardinal Flower**

Lobelia cardinalis

Plant Description - native, herb/wildflower, deciduous, perennial

**Height:** 2-4 ft Width/Spread: 1-2 ft



## Leaves

Shape: lanceolate

Margin: serrate

Form: simple

Leaf Description: dark green leaves are pointed at both ends and grow up to 4 inches long; lower portion of unbranched, erect stem lined with leaves

**Flower/Bloom** 

Flower Color: red or blue

In Bloom: May – Oct

### Flower Shape: tubulate

Flower(s) Description: terminal raceme (compact cluster of small flowers attached by short equal stalks at equal distances along the end of a stem) up to 8 inches long; flowers are 1-2 inches long, resupinate (twisting as they open) and have 2 lips with the upper portion two-lobed and the lower divided into three parts and spreading, all parts uniting into a tube at base





# **Fruits & Seeds**

Spreads via: Seeds

Seed Type: Dry seed pod

Seed Season: Fall

Fruit and Seed Description: capsule is two-celled, holding many small golden seeds, opening at the top

# **Ecological Benefits**

Food source for Butterflies, Hummingbirds, and Other Birds

# **Maintenance Notes**

Dormant in winter; prefers moist to wet soil all of the time (water three times per week)

Arrangement: alternate
