

Lamb's Ear

Stachys byzantina

Plant Description – non-native, herb/wildflower, evergreen, perennial

Height: 0.75 – 1.5 ft Width/Spread: 1 – 1.5 ft





Leaves

Shape: lanceolate

Arrangement: opposite

Margin: crenate

Form: simple

Leaf Description: 3-6 inches in length and width, thick, soft, hairy/velvety, gray-green leaves which typically form a rapidly spreading mat approximately 4-6 inches off the ground, flattened at the apex (tip), and underside may be purple

Flower/Bloom

Flower Color: pink, purple, lavender

In Bloom: May - Jul

Flower Shape: labiate

Flower(s) Description: Less than 1 inch, growing upright from the center of the leaves, sessile (without a stalk), tiny, purplish-pink flowers rising above the foliage to 10-15 inches





Fruits & Seeds

Spreads via: Seeds & Rhizomes

Seed Type: Nut

Seed Season: Fall

Fruit and Seed Description: brown/copper-colored dry fruit that does not split open when ripe

Ecological Benefits

Food source for Butterflies and Other Pollinators

Maintenance Notes

Dormant in winter; prefers average watering (*water two times per week during the summer and once per week during the rest of the year.*)
