

Southern Woodfern

Dryopteris Iudoviciana

Plant Description – native, fern, deciduous, perennial

Height: 3-4 ft **Width/Spread:** 2-3 ft





<u>Leaves</u>

Shape: lanceolate Arrangement: whorled

Margin: lobed Form: compound

Leaf Description: triangular, shiny, leathery, dark green fronds (leaves); fronds are dimorphic (of two shapes): fertile fronds are upright, up to 3' long, narrower; sterile fronds are reclined, up to 1.5', less narrow; stalk of leaf covered in light brown, papery scales

Flower/Bloom

Not a flowering plant



Fruits & Seeds

Spreads via: Spores & **Seed Type:** Spore-bearing Cone Rhizomes

Fruit and Seed Description: no fruit or seeds, reproduces by spores; spores are found in sori on the bottom of the fronds

Ecological Benefits

white-tailed deer browse leaves during summer; can provide significant cover for wildlife; value of this fern to wildlife appears to be low overall

Maintenance Notes

Dormant in winter; prefers moist to wet soils at all times (water three times together)
